FILM *White Like Me*

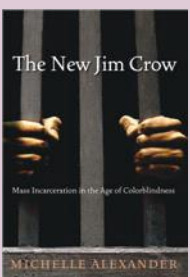
In this film anti-racist educator Tim Wise explores race and racism in the U.S. through the lens of whiteness and white privilege.

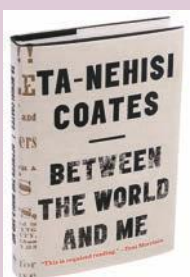

The New Jim Crow is an account of the rebirth of a caste-like system in the United States, one that has resulted in millions of African Americans locked behind bars and then relegated to a permanent second-class status.

Why Do We Exist?

RABBI MICHAEL S. FRIEDMAN, SENIOR RABBI



At our annual summer retreat Temple Israel's clergy and staff wrestled with a core question. Why does Temple Israel exist? What does Temple Israel offer that we can't get anywhere else?

After all, we are among the most fortunate human beings on earth. We exist in a community of educational achievement and professional success. We are committed to an array of causes and organizations. We lead busy lives. We are financially secure. What can Temple Israel (or, Jewish life) possibly contribute to such a privileged existence?

Temple Israel brings wonder and awe to a life of fullness and accomplishment. Experiencing wonder moves us from focusing on our problems to counting our blessings. Awe inspires us toward true appreciation for what we have rather than what we lack. Thus, Temple Israel gives us the things money cannot possibly buy, but which are essential to living a worthwhile life. We gather at the end of a hectic week, using Shabbat to re-center ourselves on what's most important. We celebrate Jewish ritual to access gratitude and ecstasy. We teach Torah to provide age-old answers to our most pressing questions. We practice the mitzvah of generosity.

At the same time, we know that for some the image of perfection is nothing more than a façade. Each of us has friends and neighbors struggling with an unexplained illness, a recent devastating loss, a difficult career setback, an unhappy home life. Let us not be fooled into thinking that our "bubble" is homogeneous. There is real heartbreak and disappointment and need and loneliness within our congregation. Moreover, we live in a world that seems increasingly turbulent. Violence and misfortune seem to strike without prediction.

Temple Israel brings hope to a world of tumult and uncertainty. We do this by gathering at times of personal or communal crisis, lending one another comfort and strength. We support one another through illness and shiva. We stand firm on our eternal values as defined by our ancestors and taught from generation to generation. We clearly state our values in the public arena and boldly act upon them: against hate, intolerance, and anti-Semitism; in support of the rights of immigrants; across boundaries of race and faith.

My childhood rabbi, Rabbi Jerry Davidson, encapsulated the Jewish story elegantly. "[We are] a people that have endured, [and] in spite of everything, have never failed to hope and to dream," he wrote.

That's it. Temple Israel exists to nourish hope and sustain dreams for all humanity. We do this within a community of fullness and accomplishment, in a world of tumult and uncertainty. Through the years, may we always be privileged to achieve wonder, hope and awe together.

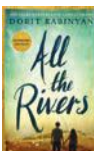
