Our Eternal Values

As protesters gathered at airports last month, a group of teens from Temple Israel were in Washington, D.C. for a weekend of learning about the most important legislative issues before Congress. Then on Monday, they visited the offices of Senators Blumenthal and Murphy and Congressman Himes where they spoke passionately about the issues most important to them.

While I am proud of all of our teens who lobbied our elected officials, I want to particularly highlight what Amanda Cohen and Abigail Ross chose to say about welcoming immigrants and refugees into our country. Their words reflected the fact that **our commitment to refugees and immigrants is neither new nor fleeting**. On the contrary, it is an essential part of who we are as Jews and of the actions we have taken as a congregation.

Amanda and Abigail began by grounding their argument in the most essential of Jewish principles, quoting Leviticus 19, the Holiness Code: "When strangers dwell among you in your land, you shall not do them wrong. The strangers who dwell among you shall be treated as the natives among you. You shall love them as yourself; for you were strangers in the land of Egypt."

Amanda and Abigail noted that our history places a responsibility upon us. "We, as Jews, were once considered 'strangers,' so we must remember the many struggles faced by today's immigrants." They told personal stories of "great grandparents [who] traveled to America as refugees when the Holocaust began, and were fortunate to have been accepted into this country at a time of great need... and start a new life." Noting their appreciation, Amanda and Abigail said, "It is up to us to create the same opportunities for today's immigrants that we were given by being welcomed into this country in the past."

Amanda and Abigail concluded by speaking about Temple Israel's longstanding commitment to the rights of immigrants and refugees: "We are extremely proud to come from a community that lives the value of welcoming the stranger." They spoke of Temple Israel's participation in Westport Interfaith Refugee Settlement, which has successfully resettled a Syrian refugee family in our area and helped them start a new life.

For the past 15 months we have partnered with six other local congregations in an interfaith coalition to resettle a refugee family here in our community. Since the Almasri family's arrival in July a team of over 100 volunteers has successfully procured a home for them, provided

daily English lessons, and ensured that they are comfortably settled in our community. The daughter and son are now both excelling in elementary school. Mohammed has found temporary employment and is training to be an interpreter. We are committed to ensuring that they feel safe and secure here, and to helping them achieve levels of educational and personal achievement that so many of us enjoy. You can read more about our efforts at <https://06880danwoog.com/2016/12/12/westports-syrian-saga/>. We are also exploring the possibility of welcoming a second refugee family in the coming months.

Temple Israel is also proud to be part of CONECT, Congregations Organized for a New Connecticut. Last month Cantor Sklar and nearly 20 of our congregants attended a huge solidarity event at a Catholic church in New Haven. One after another, members of our diverse CONECT community stood up to pledge support for

immigrant and refugee communities here in Connecticut. We committed to stand against intimidation and bias in every form, and to stand up for the rights of ALL our residents and citizens of ALL ethnicities and religions. **I invite you to join us on Thursday, February 16 at 7:00 p.m. at St. James Church in Stratford** where again CONECT will gather, hundreds strong, to make commitments for action on behalf of immigrants and refugees in 2017.

Grateful for God's many blessings, for the partnership of our neighbors, and for the wisdom of our teens like Amanda and Abigail, let us always continue to live out the commandment to welcome the stranger here in Westport and in our national life.

ELAINE GASTWIRT COLLEGE OUTREACH FUND CELEBRATES 25 YEARS OF GIVING

April 1992. That was the postmark date on the first care package sent by Temple Israel to its college students studying away from home. In the 25 years since then TI has sent roughly 4,000 care packages through its Elaine Gastwirt College Outreach Fund initiative.

The Fund was set up in the loving memory of Elaine Gastwirt, who was an active member of the TI community, and whose passion was serving Jewish youth. The Fund enables TI to stay connected with its college students by sending them care packages during the school year.

The packages communicate to our college students that TI has not forgotten them, and continues to consider them a part of the TI community.

Andi Rosenblatt, a TI Class of 2016 graduate, was recently on the receiving end of a TI care package. "It was really awesome receiving the Hanukkah package from the Temple because it is nice to know that there is a loving community at home looking out for you no matter where you are," said Rosenblatt, who is a freshman at Dickinson College in Pennsylvania.

Packages are sent at Chanukah, Purim, and Passover. The Fund bears the full costs of the packages, and participation is free. This year nearly 50 students are receiving packages.
