Nurture Spirtual Practice

From time to time each of us has heard a friend or neighbor extol the benefit of his or her "spiritual practice." In response we may have raised an eyebrow, imagining an uncomfortable "new-age" practice, the chanting of bizarre mantras or visits to some smoke-shrouded guru.

Such images are an unfortunate misconception. A spiritual practice can be any regular activity that helps you calm down, clear your mind, and re-center yourself.

Many of you know that I run regularly, most usually three times per week. Some spiritual practices involve exercise. Some spiritual practices bring you into nature: hiking or

walking your dog. Some engage your creativity: cooking or painting. Some center on one's state of consciousness: meditation or yoga. It may take time to find the right spiritual practice for yourself.

A spiritual practice must be freely chosen. It must be undertaken regularly, even when you're tired or not in the mood. A spiritual practice need not be a daily routine; once a week may be enough. But your practice does need to be long enough to take you out of your current mental space and into a different place for a period of time. It cannot be done while driving, or taking care of your kids, or looking at a screen.

When you're done you feel less stress. You are more focused on your priorities. You have a greater awareness of who you are and your place in the universe.

Those who have a regular spiritual practice feel more balanced, more capable of dealing with the unexpected. They need less caffeine to get them going and less alcohol to wind themselves down.

A spiritual practice can be Jewish. Regular Torah study would certainly qualify. Our weekly Saturday morning Torah study group not only immerses itself in the world of Torah but also creates a tight and caring community. I have a friend who gets up early to volunteer at a soup kitchen once a week. You might pause to celebrate the beginning of Shabbat in your home, using the physical rituals of candles, wine and challah, and then carefully reviewing the successes and failures of the week in your mind or out loud with your family.

I have recently added a new Jewish spiritual practice to my own routine. Many mornings I feed both of our twins their bottles simultaneously, as they sit propped in a tandem seat designed just for that purpose. With both hands occupied and eyes fixed on our children, I quietly say or sing the morning blessings from our prayer book. These are words that I have committed to memory over many years of repetition. They seem to calm Goldie and George and allow them to focus on their bottles. Some mornings I feel like I have given myself a little gift, by starting my day focused on wonder and gratitude.

The longer days of spring and summer can be a perfect time for each of us to nurture our own spiritual practice. Find something new that works for you. Or refresh a beloved practice that you once left behind. Do it with intention. Stick to it. You will thank yourself.

ECC Director Visits Israel With URJ Educators

SEES BRIGHT FUTURE FOR ISRAEL

Carol Schoke Early Childhood Center Director Nancy Isaacs experienced what she called "the trip of a lifetime" over a 10-day journey to Israel in February. Facilitated and planned by the Early Childhood Division of the Union for Reform Judaism (URJ), 40 educators deepened their knowledge of Israeli education, culture and history through visits to preschools, historical sites, kibbutzim and cultural institutions. The wealth of knowledge and experiences gained will support and inform deeper planning of Israel curriculum in the early childhood classrooms.

According to Isaacs, one of the most moving experiences of the trip was visiting the Peace Mural on the wall separating Israel from Gaza. "Being so close to the wall separating Gaza from Israel reinforced all the barriers to peace. Contributing a stone to the peace mural was merely symbolic, but a reminder of both the possibilities and obstacles that lay in Israel's path to peace," she said.
