It's Up to Us

This month the 45th President of the United States will be inaugurated. I know that some in our congregation have high hopes for the new administration. Others are concerned for what the future may hold.

We have all lived long enough to see the inauguration of presidents we supported and voted for as well as those we did not. Moreover, none of us can truthfully claim to have agreed

with every decision a president has made. Nor, if we are honest, can we say that we opposed every decision a president has made.

More importantly, as administrations have come and gone, we have learned that presidents can only do so much.

Broad societal change rarely comes from the top down. For example, marriage equality was not achieved by force of government. On the contrary, it was achieved because individuals - often acting on the basis of their religious convictions - gradually laid the groundwork for acceptance of gays, lesbians and same-sex relationships in their families, their communities and their houses of worship. Only once there was broad support did certain states legalize marriage equality. And only once a tipping point had been reached did the president express his support and did the Supreme Court act.

In fact, throughout the history of America great social change has always come from the bottom up. And often people of faith have played a leading role. I think about the great movements in our history: the abolition of slavery, child labor, temperance, women's suffrage, civil rights, and LGBTQ rights. Each of these movements was nurtured, supported and strengthened by religious people acting out the values of their faith in the public sphere.

We should not expect change to come from our government. To the contrary, we should only expect it to come from ourselves. I pray that we, as religious people of good faith, will have the courage and fortitude to work for societal change - as we would no matter who is in the White House.

Together, may we give every American the chance to succeed educationally and economically. Together, may we ensure that everyone has access to quality affordable health care. Together, may we keep one another and all our neighbors safe.

A Message from the President

Fellow Congregants,

I'm actually sitting writing this column on the weekend after Thanksgiving. And as much as I am NOT thankful for the outcome of the Michigan/Ohio State game this afternoon...there are many things for which I am incredibly thankful. No doubt, most important of these are the health and happiness of my family. But as President of Temple Israel, I've got a brand new list this year. First and foremost of course is the hard work and dedication of our clergy and staff-working tirelessly each and every day to make Temple Israel feel like home for all of us. I'm also greatly appreciative of all of our lay leaders, board members and volunteers, all of whom give of their time and energy for the benefit of our entire community.

But this year, I'm particularly thankful for the support of our members as we initiated the Annual Fund for Temple Israel. While I certainly don't want this to be the only subject you ever hear from me about, given that we are coming to the end of our focused effort for 2016/2017 (don't get me wrong, we'll happily welcome any additional contributions!), I thought it was important to let you know how successful we have been in this, our inaugural year.

At the time of this writing, we've received contributions or pledges from over 100 member families, ranging from donations of \$18 to Leadership Gifts in excess of \$10,000. And while we still won't quite close our operating budget deficit this year, we have well surpassed the fairly conservative targets built into this year's budget. We'll still have some hard work to do next year as we strive to not only meet but to exceed this year's results, but it's truly been a terrific start.

Equally as important as the financial results, the feedback I've received suggests that we've also been successful introducing this concept, an annual appeal for additional funding to support our operating budget, in a manner that is consistent with our values. I've had the opportunity to sit in discussions with many congregants – in congregational forums, committee meetings and other settings, – sharing some of the basic trends and facts that lead the Board to determine that this was a necessity. What has been universal is how much attendees have appreciated the communication and the transparency, so much that many have asked me to consider how to more broadly share this information with all members. I haven't solved that yet, and am open to any suggestions, but know that the information is available to anyone who is interested – just email me at president@tiwestport.org.

So thanks to all of you who have given, attended any one of these meetings or information sessions or have asked great questions and provided valuable suggestions for this effort. We will certainly learn from this year's campaign and look forward to your support as we move forward.

TROUBLE IN THE TRIBE WITH DOV WAXMAN SUNDAY, JANUARY 15 at 10:00 AM

Israel used to bring American Jews together. Now it is driving them apart. *Trouble in the Tribe* explores the increasingly contentious place of Israel in the American Jewish community. In a fundamental shift, growing numbers of American Jews have become less willing to unquestioningly support Israel and more willing to publicly criticize its government. More than ever before, American Jews are arguing about Israeli policies, and many, especially younger ones, are becoming uncomfortable with Israel's treatment of Palestinians. Dov Waxman argues that Israel is fast becoming a source of disunity for American Jewry and that a new era of American Jewish conflict over Israel is replacing the old era of solidarity.


