Temple Teens to be Confirmed

Shavuot will be celebrated this year on Tuesday evening, June 3 at 7:30 pm and Wednesday, June 4 at 9:00 am. The Tuesday evening service will be a Temple-wide celebration of Confirmation and will be led by our tenth-grade confirmands. Shavuot is the last pilgrimage holiday of the Jewish year and celebrates the giving of the Law at Sinai and the Covenant made between God and the Jewish people. Wonderful Celebrations at Temple Israel

It is hard to believe that the year has already passed — an amazing year full of experiences! This year I have learned, taught, experienced, helped, explained, played, shared, tasted, and especially enjoyed. There is no doubt that this year has changed me for the better--I am completing this year as a "different Lital" than when I started it.

I have had so many amazing experiences here. One of them happened just recently. I created a special program about Yom Hazikaron (the day dedicated to remembering the Israeli Fallen Soldiers and Victims of Terrorism) and Yom Ha'atzmaut (Israeli Independence Day). We started with a ceremony about our Memorial Day for fallen soldiers and victims of terror; the children took part and told stories about fallen soldiers and each story was told in a video with a song that a soldier wrote; it was so touching. It was important to share with them how we mark

the day in Israel and how critically important and vital this day is for all of us. In Israel, there is a shared "National Pain," a unity of the people, because everybody has either lost a loved one, or knows someone who has lost a loved one defending the country. All day, there are memorial services and even the television and radio stations broadcast special programs and services. People tend to wear white, there are ceremonies in schools and you can just feel it in the air. Yom Hazikaron eve in Israel opens with a siren that is heard all over the country. For two minutes, Israelis stop everything, including driving, and stand in silence, commemorating the fallen and showing respect. Right after the ceremony, we then have a meal, straight from the sadness to happiness, like in Israel. Ending at sundown, the somber, reflective mood of Yom Hazikaron gives way to the celebration of Yom Ha'atzmaut (Independence Day), a transition which emphasizes the lasting tie between the sacrifice of the country's fallen and the continued existence of the State of Israel. Thanks to those who have sacrificed themselves in war, we can celebrate the right to have our own country - the State of Israel!

At our program this year at Temple Israel, we had an Israeli dinner and then we enjoyed different activities about Israel: learning about Israeli inventions, visiting places in Israel (we traveled in Israel with Google maps), playing Israeli Jeopardy and we played an Israeli childhood game. Everyone really enjoyed it (including me ;). I have no doubt it was one of my most successful days for the year. Similar to this program, I facilitated a bunch of other activities during the year, we learned about different holidays and how they are celebrated in Israel, we learned about the Hebrew letters, we did memory games about colors in Hebrew, we learned songs, we learned how to say "family" (and learned about my family), we saw pictures from Israel on my vacation in February, we ate Falafel with Pita Bread, we prepared pictures of trees--one half were filled by the children at Temple Israel and the other half were filled by kids at my school in Afula. We even made a grass head and made trees from arts and crafts for Tu B'Shvat. We made a game where we learned how special Shabbat is in Israel, and we tried to match the Israeli singer to the songs—and how we danced!

An unforgettable Kabbalat Shabbat Service, followed by a *Taste of Israel* program, was presented by all of the 15 young Emissaries from Southern New England at Temple Israel, and we took part in the Tefila/worship; we ate Israeli food that we cooked, we prepared bracelets with Hebrew letters, Israeli mobiles and wrote letters to soldiers, played Wheel of Fortune with questions about Israel, we talked about the army, and of course we danced numerous Israeli dances. In addition to all this, I had my own group on Tuesday evening, a group of older kids. We learned about Israel from a different point of view, as they were more mature, so we were able to play a few games, but mainly we had in depth discussions about Israel. I enjoyed every minute with them! And how can we forget the Preschool children I was fortunate enough to visit several times? We shared many fun activities, and I showed them a map of Israel and played games about different places. I told them stories, prepared Hebrew name tags and so much more!

With all of these teaching moments, I feel I also learned so very much on a personal level. I learned about the American people, American culture, about the various types of synagogues here, and I watched more sport games, and ate more donuts, and I celebrated Thanksgiving and Halloween. I saw snow falling from the sky, I saw squirrels running in the streets, and deer crossing the road. I spoke more English (a lot more!), and I had my Bat Mitzvah here where I finally was able to read Torah from the Bima! I even lived with two amazing host families from Temple Israel!

I want to take this time to thank you all -- the amazing and supporting staff and students at Temple Israel.

I always knew I loved Israel, and thanks to this year, I understand why I love Israel so much! So thanks for making me love Israel even more. I realized that no matter which side I will be on, in Israel or here in United States, I will always miss the other side. So thanks to every single one of you that made this year as amazing as it was! Hope to keep in touch with you and meet you in Israel.




